Companies converting to CIO structure

A very small number of churches incorporated as a company limited by guarantee before the CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) structure became available in 2012. Draft legal regulations are now in place which will provide a simple process for charitable companies to convert to a CIO should they wish to do so. This may also be useful for churches with projects that were established as companies or as CICs (Community Interest Companies). Click here for more information.



Policy Compliance

When did you last check policy compliance? We can all have wonderfully articulated grievance, discipline, safeguarding or health and safety policies, but do we actually check our teams are complying with them? Having conducted several investigations recently, these may have been avoided by the leadership 'dip sampling' compliance on a regular basis. This demonstrates support for our teams and that leaders take the policies seriously. Any checks carried out should be fully documented. Baptist Holiday Apartments in Minehead Somerset

Having no descendants, Walter Fabry left his estate to be used to establish a Christian charitable work. The trustees of his estate bought 1 The Esplanade in Minehead in 1975 and converted it into holiday flats, including some suitable for people with disabilities. The eight apartments on the sea front are suitable for between 1 and 9 people - two of them can be joined together for a family of up to 17 people. Sam Sharpe, born in 1801 in Jamaica, was an enslaved man, a Baptist deacon, a freedom fighter and the main instigator of the 1831 Slave Rebellion in Jamaica which was instrumental in bringing about the abolition of slavery.
