End Hostility - JPIT campaign

The Joint Public Issues Team is launching a campaign to challenge the government's approach to illegal immigration, which they say is leading to destitution, discrimination and distrust. The Team has published their report, *Destitution, Discrimination and Distrust: the web of the hostile environment* and is inviting churches, church groups and individuals take action to challenge the hostile environment. A resource to help youth groups explore what we mean by 'the hostile environment' and consider what a Christian response might be is also available to download.



'We want to change perceptions'

Popular recent stories in *The Baptist Times* have included an **interview** with Esther Day of London Road Baptist Church. Esther has been pioneering a new chaplaincy in Lowestoft, and speaks about wanting to change people's perceptions of Christianity. The seventh annual Sam Sharpe lecture, at the University of Roehampton in London, will be given by Rose Hudson-Wilkin (Chaplain to the Speaker of the House of Commons, Priest Vicar at Westminster Abbey and Chaplain to the Queen) who will be exploring issues of justice.
