
The Meaningful Treat Pack - A Real Halloween Treat

The seventh annual Sam Sharpe lecture, at the University of Roehampton in London, will be given by Rose Hudson-Wilkin (Chaplain to the Speaker of the House of Commons, Priest Vicar at Westminster Abbey and Chaplain to the Queen) who will be exploring issues of justice.
