### Baptist Union Council

Justice concerns were at the heart of the latest meeting of Council in mid-March. Council members gathered to consider changes to our Union's ethical investments policy, which had last been updated in 2013. 'Enabling Baptist Voices and Action in the Public Square' is one of the four areas of shared work across Baptists Together, and members heard a presentation about the Joint Public Issues Team. There was also a presentation from the Gender Justice Group, and reflections on the Kingdom of God were woven into the time together. 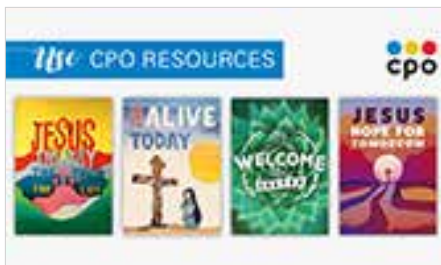
### Three Friends and the Miracle Man

### Firestarters - various dates - May, October, November

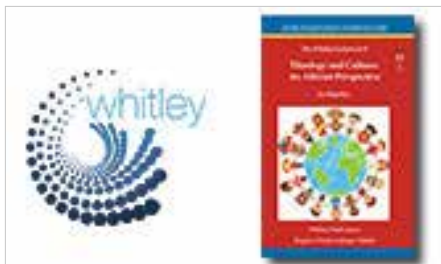
