

# **Moving the Goal Posts (Losing the Game)**

#### Introduction

The purpose of this study is to consider the changing nature of our culture, and the need for us as individuals and churches to adapt our approaches to presenting the gospel accordingly.

### Opener

"The older you get, the harder it is to change!" Do you agree? Why? Why not?

## Bible study

Read 1 Corinthians 9:12-27.

#### Question 1

What is the main point that Paul is making in verses 12-15?

Paul has rights, specifically to financial support from the Corinthians for his gospel ministry. But he would rather forgo these rights for the sake of the gospel. The gospel is everything.

#### Question 2

Consider some of the ways in which Paul made adjustments for those he wanted to win for Christ (19-22). What might Paul's approach look like in your own culture?

### Question 3

What does Paul say about his purpose and attitude in verses 23-27?

His purpose (23, 25, 27) is to share in the blessings of the gospel, to ensure he is not disqualified himself, and to get a crown that will last. His attitude is one of single-minded, goal-oriented discipline.

#### Question 6

Author John Maxwell says, "When it comes to change, there are three seasons of timing: people change when they hurt enough that they have to, when they learn enough that they want to, and when they receive enough that they are able to."

What season are you in as a church, and as individuals?
