Introduction

Bible study

Read 1 Corinthians 9:11-27.

Question 1

What is the main point that Paul is making in verses 12-15?

Question 2

Consider some of the ways in which Paul made adjustments for those he wanted to win for Christ (19-22). What might Paul's approach look like in your own culture?

Question 3

What does Paul say about his purpose and attitude in verses 23-27?

Question 4

Ken outlines the background to the butterfly swimming stroke, which was an innovation in its day to secure a competitive advantage in breaststroke swimming.

In addition to what we are already doing, how can we do things differently as churches and individuals to win the lost?

Author John Maxwell says, "When it comes to change, there are three seasons of timing: people change when they hurt enough that they have to, when they learn enough that they want to, and when they receive enough that they are able to."
