

A short guide to hosting a Listening Project event.

The Background

Commissioned by the Mission Forum in November 2017, the Listening Project is an interactive workshop based around 7 questions, designed to gather information about what those within the Baptist Family perceive God is up to at this time. The hope is to build up a picture of where we see God at work so that we can give thanks and celebrate, direct the resources we have to the places that need them and more confidently join in the work of the Kingdom.

This booklet provides information on how to host a 'Listening Project' event in your church and what to do with the information that you gather.

Getting Storted

1. Decide how to host your Listening Project event.

You could:

- (a) invite people to come to a workshop at a specific time and place or
- (b) invite people to participate at an existing event (eg after worship on a Sunday)

2. Gather the resources that you will need to run the session.

Each question has a 'kit list'. Most of the items are readily available (pens and paper) or things that can easily be improvised (dried beans for marbles etc. - that'll make more sense when you get to Question 9!)

3. Set up your space and give people clear instructions.

Give yourself time to set up the resources in the space that you are using and make sure that it is clear what people are being asked to do. Whether you're hosting a specific workshop or running it alongside/after another event, people can complete the questions in any order and in their own time. In case people drift off at different times, remember to thank them for their time and input at the start.

4. Collate the answers.

Once people have had chance to participate, collect up the sheets and use the 'Recording Responses' form to collate what people said.

5. Review Responses and Submit


Take time to look over the responses. What is there to celebrate? Is there anything that surprises you? How might your local church family use this information going forward?




