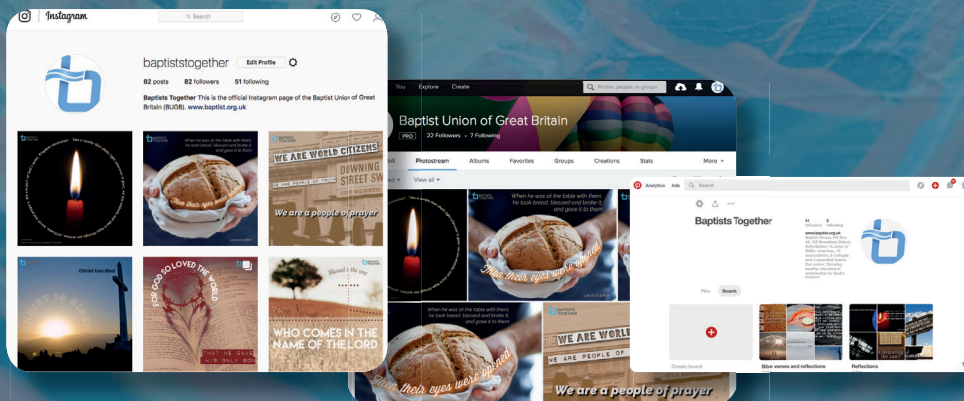


We really do want our Union to feel like one team – and hope these ways of communication can help to ensure everyone feels included.

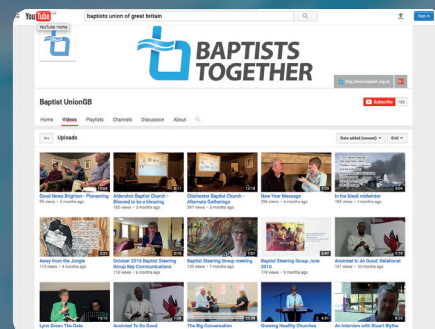
