


Hong Kong Response Project

The Home Office has estimated that nearly 300,000 Hong Kongers who have British National (Overseas) nationality, and their dependents, will take up a new visa route over the next five years, and will be moving to the UK. We want to help Baptist churches to know more about Hong Kongers and offer practical support for churches. Sharon Shek was appointed to the role of Hong Kong Response Coordinator and is liaising with Baptist churches in welcoming and offering hospitality to Hong Kong migrants. Archbishops' Commission on Families and Households

The Archbishops of Canterbury and York set up the Families and Households Commission in March 2021 to find out about the pressures and challenges facing all families and households in England today. 




New Racial Justice blogs


Real Advent Calendar - a fair way to Christmas




LAMPS Collective - touring live through December 2021


