#### **Election for President - 2023-24**

Now in its third phase, the first group of women researchers are in positions of senior leadership in Baptist life and are reflecting upon topics from that perspective. 


## **March Prayer Diary**

#### **Coronavirus Guidance**

Our guidance has now been altered to reflect the UK Government's removal of statutory requirements relating to Covid-19 in England. This includes considerations for churches as we 'learn to live with Covid'. Our previous suite of guidance on re-opening church buildings, church worship, and children's, youth and families work, has been replaced by a single guidance document laying out some principles to consider. 
#### The Passion - Easter show from LAMPS


#### Zoom around the World - 7-8 March
