Project Violet, the three and a half year long research project investigating women's experience of ministry, has concluded with commitments to act on the project's findings from all parts of the Baptist community. Responses have been made to all 57 of the Requests for Change published in the Findings in May 2024. This includes commitments from across Baptist life which were compiled and presented to Baptist Union Council last month. Council members subsequently voted to affirm them. Tim Judson's timely and powerful reflection on Whiteness is a deeply personal and carefully argued appeal that combines theological insights with biblical reflection. Through exploring the trauma Jesus experienced as he anticipated the cross he opens up neglected themes in the gospels' account of Jesus' agony in the garden of Gethsemane, illuminating questions of justice and identity. 
Shine your light Christmas 2024


