





Race, religion, rhetoric and far right extremism - Saturday 8 February

Churches Together in Britain and Ireland is holding this one-day conference in London that will see churches and civil society organisations explore solutions to challenge hate and violence. It will explore how the negative rhetoric and narratives linked to 'race' and religion, have fueled far-right related activities over the last decade and a half (especially the riots in August 2024), and threaten the cohesiveness of communities on these shores. It will discuss how we arrived at this situation and explore what solutions the Church and civil society organisations can offer to challenge this proclivity. Slow wisdom: launch of resources for Baptists - Tuesday 18 February




Firestarters Conversations - Saturday 15 March


