We pray you know God's richest blessing this Christmas.



What are the Government's asylum reform proposals?



On 17 November 2025, the Government announced major proposed changes to UK asylum policy. Drawing on similar policies implemented in Denmark, the stated aim is to "restore order and control to our borders" and deter people from seeking asylum in the UK. In response, leaders from the Baptist, Methodist and United Reformed Churches expressed concern that the changes did not reflect an approach that prioritised human dignity, but instead would 'place more demands on vulnerable individuals and an overstretched system'. 
ChurchWorks Summit



The Baptist Union is represented on the ChurchWorks Commission whose vision is to bring together the Church and the Government to support the vulnerable in our communities. Tickets are now on sale for their annual summit on Friday 27 February 2026, in Central London. Looking primarily at issues linked to the mental health crisis, poverty, and supporting vulnerable children, the summit also hopes to equip local churches to work with public services, including Local Authorities and the NHS. Praying Together – Last Prayer Broadcast of 2025


